

CHIEF'S MINUTE(s)

July 10, 2019

- Incidents** – June, 2019 18 total, 8 medical, 2 structure, 2 mva, 6 natural cover, 0 public safety/assist. Structure fires were mutual aid to District 2 and Camas Valley. 2 natural cover fires were mutual aid to District 2. Fire season restrictions in effect now with no burning/mowing/chain saws 1pm to 8 pm.
- Training** – Training included defensive driving course, safety committee/training and officer's meeting, Medical (Bleeding Control), and defensive driving classroom. 3 ffs attended leadership training in Portland at national NVFC conference, and 2 ffs attended OVFFA vehicle extrication seminar in Bend. 3 ffs attended natural gas pipeline training/exercise in Roseburg with Williams Pipeline.
- Firefighters** - One additional Explorer turned 18 and moved to Volunteer FF. Two ffs certified as Wildland FF1 and Driver/Operator through DPSST.
- Explorers** - Participated in all ff training and tasks.
- Equipment** - Installing emergency lights on 1090. Vehicles ready for wildland season and in good condition. VFA grant and SPIRE grant still waiting on procurement and funding, we are approved but pending. VFA is tied in with the ODF and Federal USFS funding. FEMA Grant information is late.
- Inventory** - Updated inventories for all units in progress and will be placed in manual in office.
- Facility** Brush hogged station and weed whacked, due again. Station air fill station was certified and annual maintenance performed by Annas Consulting. Annual backflow test completed. Facility use agreement was signed with Jack Watkins – Nature Rock while he was transferring sand in our lot. Local business with good background with LRFD.
- Office/Admin** – SDIS and SDAO sent final worker's comp audit due August 23. Sent District update to be returned by August 21. County election bill received for \$230.42 and paid.
Budget (LB50 and Resolution 2019-2) to be submitted this week to County Assessor.
County Communications contract received for 3 years at \$1500 per year and \$300 annual maintenance fee. Will be billed quarterly for FY 19-20.
Met with Pacific Power about weather driven electrical shutdown, impact appears minimal to Lookingglass area and Roseburg and criteria used would have resulted in 1 shutdown in the last 10 years in Douglas County.
- Miscellaneous** - Election results/5th Director. Contacted by County Clerk/Elections that it is now too late for any write ins to be certified, would have to appoint any Director candidate.
